Who are the Lions?

Lions International is a world wide service organization, with over 1.4 million members in over 182 countries. Lions volunteer their time to help their communities and their world. Together, Lions live up to their motto:

"WE SERVE"

World-renowned author and public speaker Helen Keller challenged Lions to become "Knights of the blind". In the many years since that request was made, Lions have done just that. Lions have endeavored to conquer preventable blindness throughout the world with programs like Sight First and through the Lions Club International Foundation.

The club actively promotes and supports Young people with disabilities by raising funds for equipment for individuals in greatest need. Our Annual Children's party also provides an afternoon of entertainment and activities for children of all ages with disabilities and learning difficulties.

We also jointly run the Wellesbourne and Shakespeare Lions Raft Race which raised £11,000 this year for Motor Neurone Disease.

Why should I Consider Joining Lions?

A Lion understands that much more can be accomplished in the community as a group rather than as an individual.

Lions Club meetings are a great place to meet new friends, be entertained, learn from guest speakers and network as well as socialise with others from inside and outside our community.
